

Ordinance #14

Pertaining to the Yorking of  
Signs etc.

The Board of Trustees of the Town  
of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1 It shall be unlawful to post, stick, stamp,  
paint, or otherwise affix, or cause to be done  
by another, any notice, placard, bill, poster  
or advertisement, to or upon any sidewalk,  
crosswalk, curbing, hydrant, shade tree or  
tree box, fence, enclosure or building, or  
upon any telegraph, telephone, electric  
lighting or electric lighting pole.

Section 2 Every person who shall violate any of  
the provisions of this article shall be deemed  
guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction  
thereof shall be punished by a fine not  
exceeding One Hundred Dollars, or by  
imprisonment for more than thirty days.

This Ordinance shall take effect  
immediately.
