Greetings and welcome to the Fall 2016 San Anselmo Recreation Activity Guide!

A VISION FOR MEMORIAL PARK

In 1924, the town acquired seven acres of land and built Recreation Park, which was later named Memorial Park. Baseball fields were installed, and in 1933 the American Legion and the Boy Scouts built the Log Cabin. Early on, Memorial Park became a center of community activity, as did the baseball fields. Locals loved baseball: Teams included the San Anselmo Wildcats and a respected, semi-professional "Merchants Baseball Team."

Many describe the park as the 'crown jewel' of the town. It has been in continual use by the community for the past 92 years. Over the years a playground, tennis courts, and most recently a skate park were added. The park has never received any significant renovations. The park, in its current condition, has repair needs that total over \$3 million.

With this in mind, the Town Council is introducing an important project that will ideally involve everyone in town, the Memorial Park Master Plan project. Conducting a master plan for the park will allow for community input as to what changes might be wanted or needed, and what parts of the park need to remain but be repaired. The park has never been through a master planning process, and considering all of the current needs at the park, planning for the future makes sense.

The master plan will:

- Be informed by comprehensive public input through a variety of outreach efforts
- Upgrade amenities based on community desires
- Address key infrastructure issues
- Honor the history of the park—cultural and ecological

The Master Plan process has two main phases. Phase One, which will take place this fall, involves gathering community input related to current or future uses at the park. As described in the list below, this will include public meetings that address the overall park along with a series of meetings that seek to gather detailed information related to specific uses.

In addition to these meetings, on Saturday, Sept. 10th, we will be launching an online survey. We will also be conducting three focus group-style meetings with the Ross Valley Seniors organization, with Drake High School and with a K-5 group at Robson Park. Dates for these meetings will be listed on the Memorial Park Master Plan page of the Town's website which can be accessed by using:

Phase Two, which begins in the winter and carries through the spring of 2017, will involve a review of proposed conceptual plans. The architects, after collecting and analyzing all of the public input, will create plans that meet as many of the expressed needs as possible. The goal of Phase Two is to hear which components of the conceptual plans fit with the community's vision for the park which will lead the process toward a final, preferred plan. This will culminate in a presentation to the Town Council in May of 2017.

Through a new master plan, Memorial Park can be restored, preserved and enhanced for the enjoyment of all for generations to come. We hope that you will get involved! 
TODDLER PAINT PLAY

ROBSON AFTER-CARE

HOW WE WORK: Robson After Care (RAC) operates out of the Robson-Harrington House located at 237 Crescent Road. We are open until 6:00pm daily and follow the Ross Valley School District calendar. RAC staff will offer extended care for Kindergarten early-release or super minimum days.

WHAT WE DO: Having nearly three acres of Robson-Harrington property at our disposal, we like to stay outdoors whenever weather permits. Playing kickball, tag, and imagination games are just some of the activities our kids love - but art projects and books are always on hand for those looking for more quiet activities. 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

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



READY MARIN

Ready Marin is Marin County's website for information on emergency preparedness. It is helpful whether you are just learning about preparedness or an experienced emergency volunteer. Ready Marin's mission is to provide guidance, training and resources to keep you and your family safe during an emergency. You will find information and links to resources, checklists, and training opportunities.

Not just government agencies but all sectors of society – service providers, businesses, civic and volunteer groups, industry associations and neighborhood associations, as well as every individual citizen – should plan ahead for disaster. During the first few hours or days following a disaster, essential services may not be available. People must be ready to act on their own."

Overview of ReadyMarin.org

Plan & Prepare - Learn what supplies you should store at home, work and in your car to take care of yourself and your family for 5 to 7 days. This includes how much water to store, how to build a kit and a family evacuation plan, and means of communication in an emergency.

Get Ready - Get Ready is a County-sponsored 2-hour training, facilitated by our local Fire Departments and community volunteers, that will provide you with an overview of how to prepare your family and home. Recognizing that helping your children prepare is critical, there are activities and resource links in the ReadyKids section to comfortably bring them into the process. Additionally, a 1-hour Get Ready 5th Grade course is available to all 5th graders. Don't forget your pets! ReadyPets has great ideas to keep them safe too.

CERT - For those of you who wish to step beyond preparing your home and reach out to help your community in an emergency, train to be a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) member. This 18-hour national program will teach you skills to organize and help out in your neighborhood and community in the event of a large scale emergency/disaster. If you are a CERT graduate, Get Ready provides volunteer opportunities as well as advanced simulation events and training to both maintain, and grow, your skill set.

A MESSAGE FROM CENTRAL MARIN PD

Yellow school buses are back in the Ross Valley! Central Marin Police want to remind all drivers that they are required to stop for the stop sign when activated on a school bus. The fine for violation of California vehicle code section 22454 (a) CVC is \$680 for failure to stop for a school bus with flashing signals. The DMV point for this violation is 1 point.

Here's the section:

22454. (a) The driver of any vehicle, upon meeting or overtaking, from either direction, any school bus equipped with signs as required in this code, that is stopped for the purpose of loading or unloading any schoolchildren and displays a flashing red light signal and stop signal arm, as defined in paragraph (4) of subdivision (b) of Section 25257, if equipped with a stop signal arm, visible from front or rear, shall bring the vehicle to a stop immediately before passing the school bus and shall not proceed past the school bus until the flashing red light signal and stop signal arm, if equipped with a stop signal arm, cease operation.

Let's keep our children safe!

Bicycles on Sidewalks

Riding bicycles on sidewalks can be dangerous for pedestrians. In our highly trafficked area, occasionally bicyclists, particularly children, need to use sidewalks to safely get to a particular destination. Parents of cyclists, please remind children that if they must ride on the sidewalk, to please take particular care to avoid pedestrians and ride slowly. And, adults, if you're riding on a sidewalk, please slow down and be considerate of pedestrians.

Tips for Driving in a School Zone

- **Slow down.** The simplest thing any driver can do when there are new driving hazards is slow down.
- **Allow More Time.** As a new school year begins allow yourself more time to get where you are going until you can figure out the effects of increased traffic.
- **Stay Alert.** School is back in session, be aware.



- **Learn the Rules.** Schools usually have places for parents to drop off and pick up children. If you are driving your child to school, learn where these areas are and follow the procedures.
- **Never block pick and drop off areas.**
- **Yield to Pedestrians.** Remember to yield to children/parents in crosswalks. When a pedestrian is in a crosswalk they have the right-of-way.
- **Carpool.** If at all possible carpool with other parents to pick up and drop off children.
- **Talk with Teen Drivers.** Remind your teen drivers about the importance of being extra careful in and around school zones.

- Most importantly, parents need to surf the net with their children. It is important that if your child is computer literate, you need know the basics about what they are doing.
- There are some programs (such as Netnanny) that are commercially available that can block the blatant sites a child may visit.
- Notify the police of any attempt by adults to set up meetings with your child.

AGING AND ADULT SERVICES

The creation of this new, more responsive system was in response to the Marin Grand Jury's recommendations.

INTERNET TIPS FOR PARENTS AND CHILDREN

The following tips are about how you and your child can enjoy the Internet while maintaining your privacy and safety:

FOR PARENTS:



- Keep the computer in a common area in the house so that you can monitor your child.
- Tell your child that you have the ability to check what web sites they visited by reviewing Safari, Chrome, or Internet Explorer which keeps browser history (unless it has been disabled otherwise).



FOR KIDS:

- Never respond to messages or bulletin board ads that are suggestive, obscene, threatening, or that make you feel uncomfortable. Just like if this happened in person, it is important children tell their parents about this.
- Never agree to meet with someone you have befriended online without your parent's permission. If your parents agree to the meeting, be sure they are with you and it is in a public place.
- Some places on the internet are adults only. If you find yourself in one of those areas, leave and go to one of the cool places on the internet for kids. Parents can use the parental discretion options where necessary to block these areas.
- Never give personal information to anyone online, such as your address, phone number, parent's names, birthday, school, school hours, and the time parents and/or guardians get home from work.
- Never send pictures of yourself to anyone you meet online.
- The Central Marin Police Authority hopes that these talking points help create a dialogue between you & your children regarding precautions they should take when browsing the internet.


