MINUTES OF JULY 9th, 1935.

A regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, July 9th, 1935, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Upon request of Paul Galletti, a property owner at 162 San Francisco Blvd., that Council repair a broken culvert abutting his property, the Superintendent of Streets was authorized to procure a deed from Mr. Croker to the Town covering property through which such culvert is laid.

The Clerk was instructed to acknowledge receipt of a communication received from Sohner's Tree Service, and advise the writer that Council will consider the matter of an appropriation for tree trimming, in setting its budget for the coming year.

The annual report submitted by the Chief of the Fire Department was read and placed on file and the department was commended for its good record.

Plans and specifications for a service station on Oak Knoll and San Anselmo Aves. were submitted by the Richfield Oil Co. and having met all requirements of the local ordinance pertaining to storage tanks, etc., the matter was referred to the Building Inspector for the necessary permit.

The report from the P.G. & E. Co. covering costs of extra lighting on Alameda Ave. was received and placed on file.

MINUTES OF JULY 16, 1935.

An regular meeting of the Council of the Town of San Anselmo was held on Tuesday, July 16, 1935, and called to order at 8:30 P.M., with all Councilmen present and Councilman Fusselman presiding.

The minutes of July 9th meeting were approved as read.

Mr. Marshall, Mr. Luhrs and Mr. Pechner addressed the Board, all asking recognition of the Park and Playgrounds Committee as then constituted, with Mr. Marshall as its Chairman. As this could not be done under the Resolution of June 26, 1935, that Resolution was rescinded upon motion of Councilman Scotford, seconded by Councilman Dempsey, and passed by unanimous vote. Mr. Pechner then asked that official recognition be given to the Park and Playground Committee and it was explained in considerable detail by the Mayor that it was impossible to give this recognition under the law, but that the Council had semi-officially recognized the Committee by mentioning the name of the Committee in the minutes of the meeting of the Town Council, which was the best that could be done under the circumstances.

Communications were read as follows:- Marin County Board of Supervisors, letter dated July 15th, asking that the Town Council include an amount of \$506. in their budget for the year 1935-36, which amount to be donated to the use of the Marin County Musical Chest. The matter was left undecided at this time but to come up for subsequent consideration at the time of the tax levy for 1935-36.
