MINUTES OF THE MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 21, 1945.

An adjourned regular meeting of the City Council was held on Wednesday, November 21, 1945, at 8 o'clock P.M.

Present: Councilmen von Rotz, Smith, Love and Monte.

Absent: Councilman Kientz.
Mayor von Rotz presiding.

The Mayor and the Council received the report of the Planning Commission in connection with the rezoning of the Rodger F. Sohner property on Ross Avenue. Upon motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Monte, and unanimously passing, a resolution was adopted fixing December 11th, 1945, as the

time and place for the public hearing on said report of the Planning Commission, and the Clerk of the Town of San Anselmo ⁷⁸⁻⁴³ was authorized and directed to give the notice of such public hearing, as required by law.

A letter was received from Commander Albert H. Seimer, requesting that he be reinstated ¹⁵⁻³⁸⁻ to the office of City Engineer of the Town of San Anselmo, as of January 1, 1946. The matter of this letter was taken under consideration by the Council.

A tentative map for Hillsdale Park Subdivision was presented by Mr. James Leach, one of the subdividers, for consideration by the Council. Upon motion of Councilman Love, seconded by Councilman Smith, a resolution was ~~presented and~~ ^{and} unanimously adopted accepting and approving the tentative map of said Hillsdale Park Subdivision, as presented, upon the condition that upon the installation of water mains the Fire Chief of the Town of San Anselmo would be authorized to supervise such installation.

Mr. Mansfield Lewis addressed the Council with regard to the requirements of the Town of San Anselmo for new radio equipment. He discussed the problem at length and stated that he felt that it was now necessary to buy new equipment, and that he felt the best purchase could be made at this time from the General Electric Company, with whom he had discussed the problem, and stated that all equipment necessary to be purchased at this time could be acquired for the sum of \$3,335.60. On motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Monte, a resolution was unanimously adopted authorizing the City Clerk to purchase said equipment, and further authorizing the City Attorney to prepare a contract for the signature of the City Clerk on behalf of the Town of San Anselmo.

The matter of establishing a grade for street and curbs on Cordone Drive and Marius Street, San Anselmo, was further discussed, and the City Engineer was ordered and directed to establish such a grade.

Commander A. H. Seimer addressed the Council with regard to a proposed street not shown upon Hillsdale Park Subdivision, previously considered by the Council. Commander Seimer was advised that the tentative map had already been approved.

Councilman Love, Chairman of the Street Department Committee, ⁴⁵⁻²¹⁻ addressed the Council concerning contemplated repair of San Anselmo Avenue from Pine Street to the bridge opposite San Rafael Avenue, and suggested that a letter be written to the Marin Municipal Water District requesting that they place new water mains in said street area before this work of repaving and resurfacing should commence. He further suggested that the Water District be cautioned in the future about resurfacing when making excavations through the pavement, and that the poor workmanship on the past excavations be called to the attention of said Water District. The City Clerk was directed to write such a letter. 90

This being the time previously fixed for the consideration of the matter of the construction of a new swimming pool, the Mayor invited the numbers present in the Council Chambers to discuss the matter. There were about twenty-five citizens of San Anselmo present, and various people addressed the Council on the necessity and advisability of constructing and erecting a new swimming pool as a living war memorial. 450
