Minute of San Anselmo Planning Commission, City Hall, April 10, 1945 Heeting called to order at 8:15 p.m. by Chairman Herritt Webster

Present: Commissioners Webster; Meyerink, Thomas, Alsfnes and Sharp Absent: Commissioner Works.

Chairman Webster stated that a Mr. Grover Wilson, Box 541. Fairfax, California had contacted him a few days previously to ascertain if an adjustment could brighlowed by the planning commission permitting his erecting and mainting chicken houses and going into the chicken business on a commercial basis, including the marketing of chickens and eggs. The location to be on Jersey Road, near Alameda, on a piece of ground just within the city limits of San Anselmo and in size about approximately four acres of which about 500 faced on Jersey Road.

In the general discussion that followed it was brought out that under city ordinance #254, Section 8, item 5 specified that no chicken ranches, rabbitries, or dog kennels, farms or other connectal livestock raising could be permitted in a First Residential District.

Turther it was called to the attention of the board that recently another party had gone to the trouble of erecting buildings nearby this very location for the purpose of going into the connercial chicken business and had been denied a permit; said party having then given up the idea, sold out thier property and moved to Novata to go into the chicken business.

The board, therefore felt that it was beyond their power to make any adjustment, even though war conditions might call for some reasonable allowance. On account of the percel of ground adjoing the city limits on one side and being of a more or less hilly nature it was suggested that it might be possible for Mr. Vilson to get it rezonad so as to permit of its being used for the purpose he desired. If he wished to go to the expense of filing apetition with the customery fee of \$25.00 the board would consider it.

Secretary Sharp read a letter dated Harch 29, 1945 from James B. Knox, of the newly organized San Anselmo Harin County Chamber of Commerce asking the Planning Commission to make know to the Chamber of Commerce what progress was being made in furtherince of the interests of our town; what improvements and recommendations are in contemplation and our aims for the immediate future.

Secretary Sharp also advised that Hary Gilkey, of the County Planning Commission was desirous of ascertaining information from us and of also having some of our members meet with the County Planning Commission committee working on land use problems at this time. The members of our board suggested that we try and arrange for a meeting with Mary Gilkey with us first so we could ascertain from her what definite help we could furnish and then appoint from our board representatives to meet with her committee. The Secretary was instructed to:

1. Arrange for a mosting with Hary Gilkey at the San Anselmo City Hall, for Tuesday evening, 8 o'clock, April 17, and if that date was not acceptable to select other convenient date.

2. To notify San A nselmo Chamber of Commerce that we would confer with them after our meeting with Mary Gilley.

3. To notify Mr. Grover Wilson or his realestate representative Les Covalt of action taken on his request.



his appointment is scheduled for consideration at your regular aceting Monday, Apr. 23, 1945.
