AN ORDINANCE OF INTENTION DECLARING THAT THE PUBLIC INTEREST REQUIRES THE SUBMISSION OF AND THAT IT IS THE INTENTION OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO TO SUBMIT THE QUESTION WHETHER THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO SHALL RETAIN ITS POWERS OF CONTROL RESPECTING CERTAIN CLASSES OF PUBLIC UTILITIES.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1.- WHEREAS, an act of the Legislature of the State of California, entitled "An Act to provide for the submitting to the qualified electors of every city and county, or incorporated city or town, in this state, the question whether such cit; and county, or incorporated city or town, shall retain the powers of control vested therein respecting all or any Public Utilities, etc., etc., "approved January 2nd, 1912 provides for the submission of questions relating to the powers of control of Public Utilities to the electors at an election, and

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo desires to submit to the qualified electors of said Town the question whether the Town of San Anselmo shall retain its powers of control respecting certain classes of Public Utilities.

NOW THEREFORE, it is hereby declared that the public interest of the Town of San Anselmo, a municipal corporation of the State of California, requires the submission of, and that it is the intention of the Board of Trustees of the said Town of San Anselmo to submit the question to the qualified electors thereof whether the Town of San Anselmo shall retain its powers of control over certain classes of public utilities, or surrender them to the Railroad Commission of the State of California as provided in the Act of the Legislature approved December 23rd, 1911, and known as the "Public Utilities Act".

Section 2.- The propositions to be submitted at such election are the following:

# Proposition No. 1

Shall the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control ever Railroad Corporations.

#### Proposition No. 2

Shell the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over Street Railroad Corporations.

# Proposition No. 3

Shall the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over common carriers other than railroad and street railroad corporations?

# Proposition No. 4

Shall the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over Gas Corporations?

#### Proposition No. 5

Shall the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over Electric Corporations?

### Proposition No. 6

Shall the fown of San Anselms retain its powers of control over Telephone Corporations?

#### Proposition No. 7

Shall the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over Telegraph Corporations?

### Proposition No. 8

Shell the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over Water Cerperations?

## Proposition No. 9

Shall the Town of San Anselmo retain its powers of control over Wharfingers?

#### Proposition No. 10

Shall the Town of San Abselmo retain its powers of control over Warehousemme?

Section 3.- This Ordinance shall take effect immediately.
