

ORDINANCE NO. 130

AN ORDINANCE DECLARING ALL PLACES WHERE INTOXICATING LIQUORS ARE SOLD WITHOUT A LICENSE TO BE A PUBLIC NUISANCE AND PROVIDING FOR THE ABATEMENT OF SAID NUISANCES.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1.- Any store, place or building in the Town of San Anselmo where spirituous, malt, vinous or other intoxicating liquors or wines are sold or otherwise dispensed without a license so to do having first been obtained from the Board of Trustees of said Town, is hereby declared to be a public nuisance and the Town Attorney and the Town Marshal are hereby instructed to take the necessary legal steps to abate any such nuisances.

Section 2.- This ordinance shall not repeal or otherwise affect any other existing ordinances on this subject, but shall provide an alternative measure by which the sale or dispensation of intoxicating liquors may be lawfully regulated.

Section 3.- This ordinance is for the immediate preservation of the public peace, the facts constituting its urgency being as follows: Certain persons purport to have organized clubs, so-called, for the purpose of defying the lawful ordinances of the Town and selling or dispensing intoxicating liquors without a license.

Section 4.- This ordinance shall take effect immediately.
