

REQUIRING THE OBSERVANCE OF BELLS, GONGS OR  
OTHER SIGNALS PLACED AT RAILWAY CROSSINGS TO  
GIVE WARNING OF APPROACHING TRAINS; AND PRE-  
SCRIBING THE PENALTIES FOR A VIOLATION THEREOF.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do hereby ordain as follows:

Section 1. It shall be unlawful for any pedestrian or other person to wilfully or heedlessly disregard any automatic bell, gong or other alarm signal which may be installed at any railway crossing in the Town of San Anselmo to give warning of approaching trains.

Section 2. Whenever any automatic bell, gong or other alarm signal has been installed at or near any railroad crossing in the Town of San Anselmo, it shall be unlawful for any person to operate or drive any motor, horse drawn or other vehicle across the railroad tracks at such crossings, or cause the same to be so operated or driven, while such signals are giving the alarm of an approaching train.

Section 3. All persons violating any of the provisions of this ordinance, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding Twenty five (\$25.00) Dollars, or by imprisonment in the Town Jail not exceeding ten (10) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment; provided that judgement may be rendered requiring defendant to pay a fine or in lieu thereof be imprisoned until such fine is satisfied in proportion of one day for every \$2.00 of the fine so imposed and remaining unpaid.

Section 4. This ordinance shall into full force and effect thirty days after its final passage.
