

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE AND SALE OF  
FIRECRACKERS AND FIREWORKS IN THE TOWN OF SAN ANSELMO.

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain as follows:

Section 1. No person, firm, company, corporation or association shall, after the passage of this ordinance, fire or discharge any firecrackers or fireworks within the Town of San Anselmo, County of Marin, State of California; provided, however, that public displays of and firing or discharging of firecrackers and fireworks may be made with the written consent of the fire marshal when authorized to give such consent by the board of trustees.

Section 2. No person, firm, company, corporation or association shall, after the passage of this ordinance, bring into or sell within said Town of San Anselmo any firecrackers or fire works, except for purposes of a public display authorized by the board of trustees.

Section 3. Any person, firm, company, corporation or association violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine not exceeding one hundred dollars (\$100.00), or by imprisonment in the town jail for a period not exceeding thirty (30) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 4. This is an ordinance for the protection of the public peace, health and safety and is one of urgency, and shall take effect and become operative from and after its passage and approval. The facts constituting the urgency in this instance are the proximity of July 4, 1922, and the great probability that various persons will, to the immediate danger of said town and property and persons therein, explode and discharge fireworks on said day, unless prohibited from so doing by the existence of an ordinance prohibiting the same, and it is therefore necessary that this ordinance be passed for

the proper protection and preservation of persons and property in said town, and go into effect immediately upon its passage and approval.

ORDINANCE NO. 168

" AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE USE AND SALE OF

The Board of Trustees of the Town of San Anselmo do ordain  
as follows:

Section 1. Section 4. This is an ordinance for the protection of the public peace, health and safety and is one of urgency, and shall take effect and become operative from and after its passage and approval.
